#### Natural Resource Conservation Service Report

Luke Bowe, Soil Conservationist, United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) - Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), attended the meeting to interduce himself to the supervisors. Bowe shared he is new to the district and will be the new Soil Conservationist. He previously worked in Austin, MN for 4 years in the same role. He is originally from Chippewa Falls, WI but now resides in Kasson, MN. Bowe stated he is working on completing surveys and getting designs done.

# Treasurer's Report

#### Approval of the Treasurer's Financial Statements, Payment of New Bills

Glenn Hahn, Treasure, presented the September 2024 Financial Report, including the Balance Sheet covering what is in checking and savings, revenues of \$23,817.41, expenditures of \$98,384.31, the general ledger and aging summary, with a payables total of \$5,397.46. Adam King, District Manager, advised the supervisors the Watershed invoices have not been entered yet, we are waiting on the final times to be entered. The supervisor's discussed the treasurer's report. A motion was made to approve the September 2024 Treasurer's Report and pay bills on the aging summary, for a payables total of \$5,397.46

#### **Unfinished Business**

#### Equipment Purchase – Straw Crimper Discussion

Adam King, District Manager, presented to the board information he gathered regarding the possible purchase of a straw crimper. Adam King, District Manager, filled out three inquires on a brand-new straw crimper. Trenchers Plus out of Burnsville, MN provided a quote for a brand-new thin straw crimper, the same style as Goodhue Soil and Water Conservation District uses. Trenchers Plus has an 8ft and 16ft option, the Goodhue SWCD has an 8ft. A brand-new straw crimper would run \$15,750 plus \$2,000 to add hydraulics. The supervisors discussed questions regarding storage, transportation, and how much need the Dodge County area has. Adam King, District Manager, advised the NRCS does require straw crimping for their contracts. The supervisors would like to check into the district partnering with a current rental company such as Kasson Hardware to help solve a few of the supervisor's concerns. A motion was made to table this topic.

#### Dodge Cover Crop Program

Adam King, District Manager, presented to the supervisor's information regarding the Dodge County Cover Crop Program. King spoke with the Board of Water and Soil Resources and was informed all project receiving funding would need a

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contract with the landowner / contractor in order to record results. The FY25 Soil Health Delivery grant would allocate \$60,000 for this program. King questioned if the district would like to keep the program as is or make some changes to make it more accessible. The supervisor's discussed wanting to make changes to the original program including the contract being available after the initial contract ends to encourage keeping the practice going, adding specific wording to require incorporating the seed after harvest time, and what the exact incentive will be. The supervisor's tabled the Dodge Cover Crop Program until specific wording is added and more details are gathered by Adam King, District Manager.

# New Business

# 2025 National Association of Conservation District Dues

Adam King, District Manager, informed the supervisors the National Association of Conservation District dues will be invoiced to us shortly. The structure of the dues is set up in different tiers depending on how much the district pays. The different tiers are- Contributor (\$1-100), Bronze (\$101-\$500), Silver (\$501-\$774), Gold (\$775-1,775), Diamond (\$1776-\$3000), and Platinum (\$3001+). The district has contributed \$250 for the last two years. The supervisors discussed the different tiers. A motion was made to continue contributing \$250 and staying in the bronze tier.

# **District Cost- Share Program for 2025**

Adam King, District Manager, presented the staff recommended adopting Root River, Cedar- Wapsipinicon, and the Greater Zumbro River Watershed's cost-share program within the respective areas for the District Cost-Share Program for 2025. This will maintain consistency between programs if Watershed Based Implementation Funding for financial assistance runs out and financial assistance from district would be needed. The financial assistance or cost-share funded from the Dodge Soil and Water Conservation District Local Capacity Grants will follow the same policy guidelines and requirements as when they were received. Each project requires a cost-share application/ contract to be filled out by the land owner and technical representative prior to being presented to the Dodge Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors for approval and encumbrance. A motion was made to maintain consistency by adopting each of the watershed's cost-share programs for each portion of the county for the District Cost-Share Program for 2025.

#### Management Representation Letter to Peterson Company for the 2023 Financial Audit

Adam King, District Manager, presented the Management Representation Letter to the Peterson Company for the 2023 Financial Audit. The supervisors discussed the letter and inquired about price of the audit. King advised the supervisors it is extremely difficult to find an auditor and recommended we continue using Peterson's company. A motion was made to sign and submit the Management Representation Letter to the Peterson Company.

#### Audit of 2023 Financials

Adam King, District Manager, informed the supervisors the Peterson Company has completed the 2023 Financial Audit. The final draft has been provided by Peterson Company. The supervisors discussed the audit. A motion was made to approve the 2023 Financial Audit and for Peterson Company to submit the audit to the State of Minnesota on the district's behalf.

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#### 2024 Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts (MASWCD) Resolutions

The Dodge County Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors reviewed and individually voted on each of the 8 MASWCD resolutions. The supervisors agreed that Allison English, Administrative Professional, is authorized to submit each supervisors votes individually electronically to MASWCD.

# 2024 Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts Annual Convention

Adam King, District Manager, informed the supervisors the Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts Annual Convention is taking place on December 3-4, 2024 held at the Double Tree by Hilton – Bloomington. The registration for both days is \$330.00, \$245.00 for Tuesday, and \$205.00 for Wednesday. There is lunch and breakfast available- Lunch is \$35.00 each and breakfast is \$25.00 each. The cost for lodging is \$115.00 plus tax per night. A motion was made to approve covering registration, lodging and food expenses for any staff that is wanting to attend the 2024 Minnesota Association of Soil and Water Conservation District Annual Convention.

# FY21 Buffer Law Implementation Grant Closeout

Adam King, District Manager, presented that the grant funds for the Board and Water and Soil Resources Buffer Law Implementation Grant have been exhausted. The total of the grant was \$21,500, with an actual total of \$21,502.78 being spent. All funds were used on technical assistance for the Buffer Law, the Buffer Law mailout, and the Dodge County Cover Crop Program. There will be no funds required to be returned to the Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR) and we are now able to close out the grant. Staff recommends the supervisors authorize staff to submit the grant close-out to the Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources. A motion was made to authorize staff to submit the close out for FY21 Buffer Law Implementation Grant to BWSR.

# FY22 Buffer Law Implementation and FY22 SWCD Local Capacity Services Grant Agreement Amendment

Adam King, District Manager, informed the supervisors The Board of Water and Soil Resources FY2022 Buffer Law Implementation(P22-6189) and FY2022 SWCD Local Capacity Services (P22-6099) Grant Agreements originally expire on December 31, 2024. King informed there are still funds available to spend and will not be exhausted by the expiration date. Staff advises to file for an extension of the grants extending them out 1 year to December 31, 2025. A motion was made to authorize Adam King, District Manager, to approve, sign, and submit the Board of Water and Soil FY22 Buffer Law Implementation and FY22 SWCD Local Capacity Services Grant Agreements to extend the expiration date from December 31, 2024 to December 31, 2025.

#### FY2025 Buffer Law Implementation Grant Workplan

Adam King, District Manager, presented the FY2025 Buffer Law Implementation Grant totaling \$20,000. This is the same amount as 2024. The 2025 workplan has been changed from 2024 workplan. Money was reduced from the Equipment/ It Purchase allocation and moved to the Dodge County Cover Crop Program.

Adam King, District Manager, informed the supervisors payment for Watershed Cost-Share Contract 2024WAGZ-DC – 03 for Jack Biwer is not ready for presentation to the board. The approval of the final payment for Watershed Cost-Share Contract 2024WAGZ-DC- 03 was tabled until the next board meeting.

# Watershed Cost- Share Contract 2024WAGZ- DC- 16 (Alberts) Payment

The adjusted total amount to encumber to cover 90% of the total project cost and the additional acres of pre-construction cover will be \$31,068.00. One of the basins that was explored at a previous meeting was dry and the other one was overflowing. Mower County had to put pipes down into the basin and pump it out into a different area. It pumped out 75 gallons / minute and costed a heavy price of \$15,000.
