Tree Descriptions

Evergreen Trees

American Arbor Vitae

Moderate growth rate; tolerant to drought and poorly drained soils; grows best in moist, well-drained soils; moderately tolerant to shade; grows to 20+ ft.

Norway Spruce

Fastest growing of the spruce, can reach 5 ft. tall in 6-7 years; moderately tolerant of drought; grows best in moist, well-drained soils; tolerant to shade; grows 50+ ft (up to 150 ft.) and is a highly valued ornamental and timber tree.

Black Hills Spruce

Medium-growing evergreen; easily-cared for and tolerant to very cold conditions; adapts best to medium heavy moist soils; grows up to 60 ft. tall and 25 ft. wide

Eastern Red Cedar

Slow to moderate growth rate; tolerant to drought but grows best in moist, well drained soils; moderately tolerant to shade; touch of red to this evergreen tree; grows up to 40+ ft. tall and up to 30 ft. wide

White Pine

Fast growing, tallest conifer species in MN. Cold tolerant and hardy; pyramid shaped when young, broadening with age; long-lived. Prefers sandy or silt loam soils, but will tolerate a wide range; grows up to 100+ ft. tall and 40 ft. wide

Ponderosa Pine

Drought-resistant and will grow on most soils including very sandy soils and sites with very little topsoil; can grow to a height of six ft. in six years; is widely used in windbreaks. These large, long-needled native pines can grow up to 100 ft. tall.

Tamarack

The only deciduous conifer on the list - it sheds its needles every fall; grows in upland soils or swampy areas; produces beautiful warm golden color to needles before dropping in autumn; well-adapted to cold temperatures; grows up to 60' tall

Deciduous Trees

Paper Birch

Semi-rapid growing medium-to-tall tree; best grown in northern climate; very hardy. Shallow roots with white bark turning chalk-white as tree matures; can grow up to 70 ft. tall.

American Linden ("Basswood")

Well-formed deciduous tree with large, heart-shaped leaves and a clean, straight trunk; crown is broad and spreads rounded; can grow up to 80 ft. tall with a spread of half it's height (40-50 ft. wide)

Red Maple

Moderately rapid growth rate; prefers moist, well-drained soils but will tolerate poorly drained soils; full sun or partial shade; brilliant yellow, orange, and red fall foliage; grows to 40+ ft tall and up to 50 ft. wide

Northern Red Oak

Moderately rapid growth rate; prefers moist, well-drained soils; moderately tolerant to shade; nuts provide wildlife food source; beautiful orange to red fall foliage; grows to 50+ ft. tall and up to 80 ft. wide

Norway Poplar

Rapid growth; does well in many fertile soil types, wet to moist, will not tolerate drought; direct sun; good choice for establishing new windbreaks; grows to 40 - 60 ft.

Black Cherry

Large, long-lived tree with edible berries that are wildlife-beneficial. Grows 50-75 ft. with pollinator-friendly flowers. Adapts to wide variety of soils.

Midwest Crabapple

Excellent tree for windbreaks, wildlife habitat and recreational plantings; rapid initial growth; prefers sun and well-drained soil, and is extremely hardy and disease-resistant. Crabapples provide brightly-colored fruit and showy flowers; grows to 15 ft. tall and up to 20 ft. wide

Shrubs

Golden Currant

Loosely-branched, irregular-shaped deciduous shrub that produces bluish-green flowers that turn dull yellow in fall and emit a clove-like fragrance; fruit produced is an edible, black berry that can be used in jellies, preserves, and pies; grows up to 8 ft. tall

American Hazelnut

Moderate to rapid growth; prefers moist well drained soils; full to partial sun; small yellow flower; thicket forming shrub; nut producing; grows up to 15 ft. tall

Villosa Lilac (Late Bloom)

Moderate growth rate; prefers moist, well-drained soils; full sun; grows to 10-15 ft. with pinkish flowers.

Nannyberry

Large growing "leggy" native shrub that can be pruned into a small tree form; produces 2-3" clusters of white flowers in the spring and mature fruit are black in color. Fall color is deep maroon to red. Grows up to 15 ft. tall and prefers sun with partial

American Plum

Tall shrub or small tree; thrives in moist areas with little tolerance for drought or shade. Winter hardy; early pollinator in Spring; great wildlife food source; grows up to 20 ft. tall and up to 10 ft. wide

Serviceberry ("Juneberry")

Variety of soils; shrub that has excellent wildlife food source (fruit); pollinator-friendly white flowers; grows to 15 ft. tall and up to 12' wide
